

International Scholarships Terms and Conditions

- Scholarships are specific for the student, course and year of study, and are not transferable. Scholarships can never be deferred to a later academic year or intake.
- The scholarships are offered for one year only.
- Scholarships are subject to satisfactory academic progress and verification of academic qualifications.
- The University reserves the right to withdraw, terminate or suspend any scholarship on disciplinary or academic failure grounds.
- Scholars will be required to assist the University with marketing, publicity and events as appropriate, and also to attend scholars' networking events.
- Acceptance of a scholarship implies consent under the Data Protection Act for the University to keep in contact with the student and for the scholar's name to be published in relevant printed and online publicity materials.
- The International Undergraduate and Postgraduate Scholarships can only be awarded to and accepted by International students whose fee status has been assessed as "overseas".
- Scholarships consist of a reduction in tuition fees, and no money passes to the scholar. If the scholar pays the tuition fee by instalments, the scholarship amount will be deducted from the final instalment. If the scholar pays the whole tuition fee at the beginning of the academic year, the scholarship amount will be deducted from this payment.
- If the scholar holds a "Conditional" offer, their offer must become "Unconditional Firm" by **8th December** for the January intake. If the scholar fails to meet the above-mentioned condition, their scholarship offer will be revoked.
- Kingston University offers a range of scholarships across different faculties and departments. However, all students will only be eligible to hold one scholarship award at any one time.
- Slight variations to the above terms and conditions may occur depending on the type, level and duration of a specific student's course. Students should refer to their scholarship letter for details of these variations as they apply to them.
